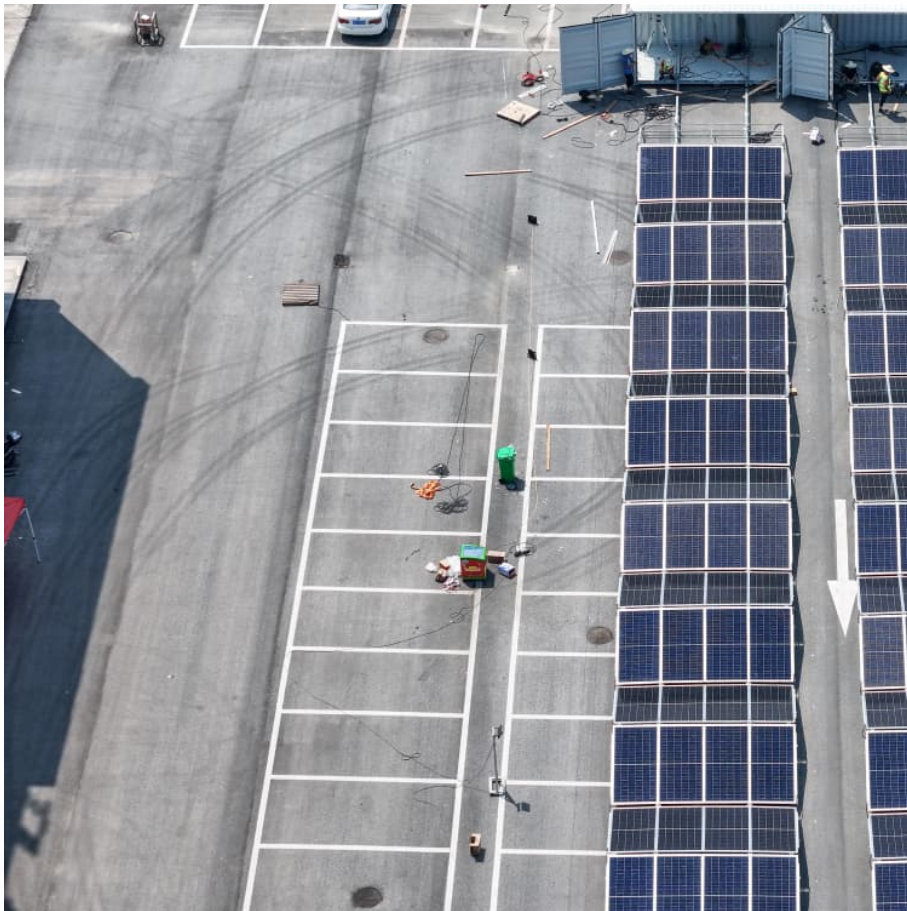


# Solar rate per kwh

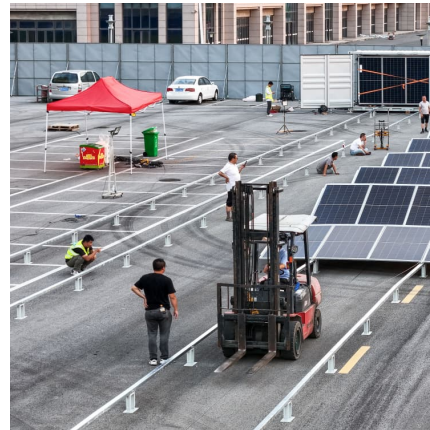

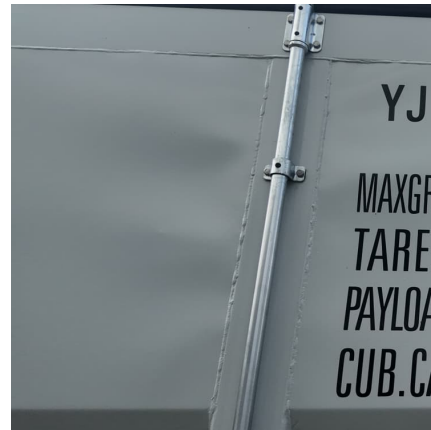
